### Open Response

**Inferential:** Your thought was not stated directly, but there is evidence for it in the text; it is hinted at, suggested, or implied.

**Critical:** Your original thought, opinion, connection, or critical question is related to the text.

**Theme Notes:** A list of all the themes or ideas you think the author is bringing up in the text.
